Sunday School Lesson December 19, 2021, Grace Baptist Kearneysville, West Virginia

"Purity" *Is. 6:1-8*

Open:

- The book of Isaiah was written to...
 - Reveal to God's people the wickedness of their way. <u>Is. 1:2-4</u>
 - Remind God's people of God's judgment on sin. Is. 1:7-9
 - Show Gods people the need of their **Return** to obedience of God's Word. <u>Is. 1:17-19</u>
- $\hfill\square$ Isaiah is called to deliver a message to Israel
 - Message of Purification to an unclean people. Is. 1:16-17
 - Message of Judgement to an unconfessed people. Is. 1:5-6, 20
 - Message of Hope to those who choose to repent of their sins. <u>Is. 1:18-19</u>
- □ By the time Isaiah is done receiving this message from God (in chapter 5), we find Isaiah (in chapter 6) realizing the lack of faith (**Rom. 14:23**) in his own life.
 - Isaiah like many other children of God had been lulled to sleep over the last 52 years of the good reign of King Uzziah. <u>vs. 1</u>
 - Grew cold and indifferent.
 - Grew comfortable with who they were.
 - Transferred their faith from a faith in the King of kings to a faith in who the king was.
 - It was not until Isaiah realized that his focused had shifted from who God was and that God was in control that he recognized the condition of his own life. <u>vs. 2-5</u>
 - The Holiness of God revealed the impurities of his own life.
 - The Presence of God revealed the power of God available in his life.
 - The Message of God revealed the lack of obedience in his life.
 - Once Isaiah recognized who he was when compared to God, we find not only a purging from sin in his life, but we also find a renewal of purpose in his life. <u>vs. 6-8</u>
 - We find the power of God bringing humility into his life.
 - We find the Word of God purging the sin into his life.
 - We find the voice of God bringing a renewed purpose in his life.

Tran:

□ The standard of purity is not what I determine, but what God has predetermined. Is. 5:20-24

- Purity is not being cleaner than those around me; but by being as clean as God.
- □ Only when I see God for who He is, can I see myself as I should (as God sees me). Is. 6:1-5
 - When I'm focused on the actions of those around me, I become distracted by the lack of obedience in my own life.
- □ An individual cannot be pure until they recognize the impurities in their life. <u>Is. 6:6-8</u>
 - We will never truly be cleansed until we see our need of cleansing.

I. We need to recognize the importance of purity in our life as a child of God.

- □ <u>Is. 1:16</u> "Wash you, make you clean; put away the evil of your doings from before mine eyes; cease to do evil;"
- □ James 4:8 "Draw nigh to God, and he will draw nigh to you. Cleanse your hands, ye sinners; and purify your hearts, ye double minded."
- A. Until we see God for who He is and as He is, we will never see ourselves for who we are

1. Isaiah – <u>Is. 6:5</u> "Then said I, Woe is me! for I am undone; because I am a man of unclean lips, and I dwell in the midst of a people of unclean lips: for mine eyes have seen the King, the LORD of hosts."

- 2. David <u>Ps. 51:3-5</u> "For I acknowledge my transgressions: and my sin is ever before me.
 [4] Against thee, thee only, have I sinned, and done this evil in thy sight: that thou mightest be justified when thou speakest, and be clear when thou judgest. [5] Behold, I was shapen in iniquity; and in sin did my mother conceive me."
- 3. Unclean generation <u>Prov. 30:12-13</u> "There is a generation that are pure in their own eyes, and yet is not washed from their filthiness. [13] There is a generation, O how lofty are their eyes! and their eyelids are lifted up."
- B. We need to recognize purity in our life cannot come by our own ability.
 - 1. **Prov. 20:9** "Who can say, I have made my heart clean, I am pure from my sin?"
 - 2. <u>Ps. 51:2,7,10</u> "[2] Wash me throughly from mine iniquity, and cleanse me from my sin. [7] Purge me with hyssop, and I shall be clean: wash me, and I shall be whiter than snow. [10] Create in me a clean heart, O God; and renew a right spirit within me."
 - 3. <u>Ps. 119:9-11</u> "Wherewithal shall a young man cleanse his way? by taking heed thereto according to thy word. [10] With my whole heart have I sought thee: O let me not wander from thy commandments. [11] Thy word have I hid in mine heart, that I might not sin against thee."
- C. I will never be close to God in a personal way, until I'm living in a pure way.
 - <u>Ps. 24:3-6</u> "Who shall ascend into the hill of the LORD? or who shall stand in his holy place?
 [4] He that hath clean hands, and a pure heart; who hath not lifted up his soul unto vanity, nor sworn deceitfully.[5] He shall receive the blessing from the LORD, and righteousness from the God of his salvation. [6] This is the generation of them that seek him, that seek thy face, O Jacob. Selah."
 - <u>Ps. 15:1-5</u> "LORD, who shall abide in thy tabernacle? who shall dwell in thy holy hill?
 [2] He that walketh uprightly, and worketh righteousness, and speaketh the truth in his heart.
 [3] He that backbiteth not with his tongue, nor doeth evil to his neighbour, nor taketh up a reproach against his neighbour. [4] In whose eyes a vile person is contemned; but he honoureth them that fear the LORD. He that sweareth to his own hurt, and changeth not. [5] He that putteth not out his money to usury, nor taketh reward against the innocent. He that doeth these things shall never be moved."

II. There needs to be a purity of mind, heart, and body in the life of a child of God

- □ God wants us to have a pure life, so we can enjoy the full benefit of salvation, a relationship with his creation. <u>Is. 1:25</u> "*And I will turn my hand upon thee, and purely purge away thy dross, and take away all thy tin:*"
- □ We are commanded to keep ourselves pure. <u>I Tim. 5:22b</u> "… neither be partaker of other men's sins: keep thyself pure."
- A. Pure mind. As children of God, not only do we have access but we are commanded to think with the same spiritual mind that Jesus thought with while he was here on earth. <u>Phil. 2:5</u> "Let this mind be in you, which was also in Christ Jesus:"

- 1. Purity of thought comes by what the mind thinks about. <u>Phil 4:8</u> "Finally, brethren, whatsoever things are true, whatsoever things are honest, whatsoever things are just, whatsoever things are pure, whatsoever things are lovely, whatsoever things are of good report; if there be any virtue, and if there be any praise, think on these things."
- 2. Purity of thought comes by the meditating on God's Word. <u>II Peter 3:1-2</u> "This second epistle, beloved, I now write unto you; in both which I <u>stir up your pure minds by way of</u> <u>remembrance</u>: [2] That ye may be mindful of the words which were spoken before by the holy prophets, and of the commandment of us the apostles of the Lord and Saviour:"
- B. Pure heart. As children of God, we are to have a heart that is clean and free from sin. <u>Heb. 10:22</u> *"Let us draw near with a true heart in full assurance of faith, having our hearts sprinkled from an evil conscience, and our bodies washed with pure water."*
 - 1. Not only are we to not entertain impure things, but we are to flee from those impurities that would defile our hearts. **II Tim. 2:22** *"Flee also youthful lusts: but follow righteousness, faith, charity, peace, with them that call on the Lord out of a pure heart."*
 - 2. We are to fervently love one another out of a pure heart. <u>I Peter 1:22</u> "Seeing ye have purified your souls in obeying the truth through the Spirit unto unfeigned love of the brethren, see that ye love one another with a pure heart fervently:"
- C. Pure body. We need to realize our bodies are not our own. <u>I Cor. 6:19-20</u> "What? know ye not that your body is the temple of the Holy Ghost which is in you, which ye have of God, and ye are not your own? [20] For ye are bought with a price: therefore glorify God in your body, and in your spirit, which are God's. "
 - 1. You cannot keep your body pure if you are constantly in and around the impure things of this world. <u>I Cor. 6:15-19</u> "Know ye not that your bodies are the members of Christ? shall I then take the members of Christ, and make them the members of an harlot? God forbid. [16] What? know ye not that he which is joined to an harlot is one body? for two, saith he, shall be one flesh. [17] But he that is joined unto the Lord is one spirit. [18] Flee fornication. Every sin that a man doeth is without the body; but he that committeth fornication sinneth against his own body."
 - 2. Knowing that we will one day stand before Jesus, should drive us to live a pure life He would be proud of. <u>I John 3:2-3</u> "Beloved, now are we the sons of God, and it doth not yet appear what we shall be: but we know that, when he shall appear, we shall be like him; for we shall see him as he is. [3] And every man that hath this hope in him purifieth himself, even as he is pure."
