"Setting in Order the Things"

Titus 1:5

Intro:

- The book of Titus was written to a young man leaving him instructions on order and decency, as well as on how to instruct those both younger and older than he to live orderly.
 - Leadership. <u>Titus 1</u>
 - Followship. <u>Titus 2</u>
 - Citizenship. <u>Titus 3</u>
 - Doctrine. <u>Titus 1:9, 13-14; 2:1,9</u>
- It's interesting to note that the Bible is instructing <u>ALL</u> ages, in <u>ALL</u> social classes, in <u>ALL</u> positions of leadership and followship.
 - Servants. <u>Titus 1:1/ 2:9-14</u>
 - Sons in the faith. <u>Titus. 1:4</u>
 - Preachers and church leaders. <u>Titus 1:5-16</u>
 - Aged men and woman. <u>Titus 2:1-6</u>
 - The youth. <u>Titus 2:15</u>
 - Citizens. <u>Titus 3</u>

Tran:

- We need to recognize the structure God has set in place, and what each person's responsibility is to obey what God has instructed.
 - "We are not all always leaders; we are not all always followers; but we are always leading, and we are always following."
 - Home As one grows up, the role in the home changes and it's important to recognize one's responsibilities at each stage. (Father, Mother, Child)
 - Church As one grows spiritually, one will increase responsibility and leadership in the Christian life. It is important for one to realize what their role is and fill it. (Pastor, Leaders, Laymen)
 - Government Each person has a civic duty to both teach and perform; that duty is paramount to the stability of a society. (Laws, elected officials, citizens)
 - If any one of these areas are out of balance, it will mutually affect all of the others.
 - We need to make sure we are learning, leading, and listening in such a way that increases the productivity in all three entities that God has established.
 - Learn what my part is and how to better perform it.
 - Lead others to do their best and to do rightly in their responsibilities.
 - Listen to godly counsel and Bible teaching on how God says things ought to be done, so I can lead the next generation to continue on.
 - God not only wants each person to understand what their current role is; but He also wants each person to learn from those around them how to be prepared to perform the soon coming added responsibilities.

I. Things that should be absent from the life of a Christian leader.

- A. Temper <u>Titus 1:7</u>
 - i. <u>**Prov. 16:32**</u> "*He that is slow to anger is better than the mighty; and he that ruleth his spirit than he that taketh a city.*"
 - ii. **Prov. 19:11** "The discretion of a man deferreth his anger; and it is his glory to pass over a transgression."
 - iii. <u>Prov. 22:24-25</u> "Make no friendship with an angry man; and with a furious man thou shalt not go: [25] Lest thou learn his ways, and get a snare to thy soul."

B. Alcohol Titus 1:7

- i. <u>Lev. 10:9</u> "Do not drink wine nor strong drink, thou, nor thy sons with thee, when ye go into the tabernacle of the congregation..."
- ii. Pro. 20:1 "Wine is a mocker, strong drink is raging: & whosoever is deceived thereby is not wise."
- iii. <u>Prov. 23:29-32</u> "Who hath woe? who hath sorrow? who hath contentions? who hath babbling? who hath wounds without cause? who hath redness of eyes?[30] They that tarry long at the wine; they that go to seek mixed wine.[31] Look not thou upon the wine when it is red, when it giveth his colour in the cup, when it moveth itself aright.[32] At the last it biteth like a serpent, and stingeth like an adder."
- iv. <u>Prov. 31:4</u> "It is not for kings, O Lemuel, it is not for kings to drink wine; nor for princes strong drink:"
- v. Eph. 5:18 "And be not drunk with wine, wherein is excess; but be filled with the Spirit;"

C. Contention <u>Titus 1:7</u>

- i. The Christian life should be lived in such a way that our lives are a good testimony and representation of Christ. <u>Rom. 14:16-18</u> "Let not then your good be evil spoken of: [17] For the kingdom of God is not meat and drink; but righteousness, and peace, and joy in the Holy Ghost. [18] For he that in these things serveth Christ is acceptable to God, and approved of men.
- ii. Division amongst people is a direct result of a selfish lifestyle. <u>Rom. 16:17-18</u> "Now I beseech you, brethren, mark them which cause divisions and offences contrary to the doctrine which ye have learned; and avoid them. [18] For they that are such serve not our Lord Jesus Christ, but their own belly; and by good words and fair speeches deceive the hearts of the simple."
- iii. Nowhere does the Bible teach, that because I am a Christian, that I have to create contention with those who are around me. <u>Phil. 2:14-15</u> "Do all things without murmurings and disputings: [15] That ye may be blameless and harmless, the sons of God, without rebuke, in the midst of a crooked and perverse nation, among whom ye shine as lights in the world;"

II. Things that should be present in the life of a Christian leader.

- A. Good Testimony
 - i. <u>I Cor. 1:8</u> "Who shall also confirm you unto the end, that ye may be blameless in the day of our Lord Jesus Christ."
 - ii. <u>Phil. 2:15</u> "That ye may be blameless and harmless, the sons of God, without rebuke, in the midst of a crooked and perverse nation, among whom ye shine as lights in the world;"
 - iii. <u>I Tim. 3:2</u> "A bishop then must be blameless..."
 - iv. ITim. 5:7 "And these things give in charge, that they may be blameless"
 - v. <u>**Titus 1:6**</u> "If any be blameless..."
 - vi. <u>Titus 1:7</u> "For a bishop must be blameless..."
 - vii. <u>Prov. 22:1</u> "A good name is rather to be chosen than great riches..."

- B. Hospitality Treating others in a kind and receptive way. Titus 1:8
 - In the Christian world, we have grown cold in our manners and our consideration towards others. We should not allow the trends of society to dictate our responses.
 - i. <u>**Rom. 12:10**</u> "Be kindly affectioned one to another with brotherly love; in honour preferring one another;"
 - ii. <u>Eph. 4:30-32</u> "And grieve not the holy Spirit of God, whereby ye are sealed unto the day of redemption. [31] Let all bitterness, and wrath, and anger, and clamour, and evil speaking, be put away from you, with all malice: And be ye kind one to another, tenderhearted, forgiving one another, even as God for Christ's sake hath forgiven you.
 - iii. <u>Col. 3:12-15</u> "Put on therefore, as the elect of God, holy and beloved, bowels of mercies, kindness, humbleness of mind, meekness, longsuffering; [13] Forbearing one another, and forgiving one another, if any man have a quarrel against any: even as Christ forgave you, so also do ye. [14] And above all these things put on charity, which is the bond of perfectness. [15] And let the peace of God rule in your hearts, to the which also ye are called in one body; and be ye thankful.
- C. Justice Treat others according to God's law, not man's judgements. Titus 1:8
 - i. <u>Micah 6:8</u> "He hath shewed thee, O man, what is good; and what doth the LORD require of thee, but to do justly, and to love mercy, and to walk humbly with thy God?"
 - ii. <u>I Cor. 4:5</u> "Therefore judge nothing before the time, until the Lord come, who both will bring to light the hidden things of darkness, and will make manifest the counsels of the hearts: and then shall every man have praise of God."
 - iii. <u>II Cor. 10:12-15</u> "For we dare not make ourselves of the number, or compare ourselves with some that commend themselves: but they measuring themselves by themselves, and comparing themselves among themselves, are not wise. [13] But we will not boast of things without our measure, but according to the measure of the rule which God hath distributed to us, a measure to reach even unto you. [14] For we stretch not ourselves beyond our measure, as though we reached not unto you: for we are come as far as to you also in preaching the gospel of Christ: [15] Not boasting of things without our measure, that is, of other men's labours; but having hope, when your faith is increased, that we shall be enlarged by you according to our rule abundantly,"

Close:

- We need to make sure that, in our homes, we have "Things Set in Order" according to the Scriptures.
- Notice the list of things you are to do is longer than the list of things you're not supposed to do.
- God is more concerned with what you are doing than with what you are not doing.
- If we are focused on what we are supposed to do, then we will be less likely to do the things we aren't supposed to do.

"Let all things be done decently and in order."
